K-2 News

Mathematical Stories

This term the students have been learning about mathematical stories. They have been learning about the different parts including the start, change and result of these problems. The students have enjoyed drawing and figuring these out on their white boards. They have also explored using different types of representations such as people, apples and bananas to create their own mathematical stories using addition and subtraction.

In our Number Talk lessons the kindergarten students have been practising recognising numbers from 11-20, these are called teen numbers. Janet and Claire have been laying out these numbers together and individually. They have been learning to recognise the numbers, place them in order and use the MAB blocks to lay out the quantity under each number. They have also been working on writing these numbers.

The students have also been working on their friends of ten and twenty through a variety of hands-on games and activities. They have also enjoyed learning about a different number system and learnt how to write roman numerals 1-10. The students created their own analogue clock using roman numerals.

<u>English</u>

The K-2 students have been practising their reading skills, reading to themselves, reading aloud to a partner and reading to the teacher. This term we have also incorporated a peer reading experience every Wednesday. The 3-6 students are paired with a K-2 student for paired reading which is for 15 minutes. Each week they take turns reading or listening to their peer read. This is a wonderful opportunity to support the students oral reading skills and develop their confidence and love of reading.

The K-2 students have been learning about "imaginative text" this term and are really engaged in the activities and lessons. So far, they have enjoyed listening to some popular fairy tales including "Little Red Riding Hood", "Hansel and Gretel" and "Jack and the Beanstalk". The students have learnt about the structure of a narrative including the beginning, middle and end of a story. They will be working towards creating their own stories to be published by the end of the term.

PDH: Health

For health this term the students focus is on "Contributing to Healthy and Active Communities".

The K-2 students have been looking at and learning about what dangers they may find at home. They are working on recognising what is safe and unsafe (what could be poisonous), and where these items should be stored. The students have also begun discussing and identifying "sometimes" and "always" foods. They have enjoyed participating in a variety of activities to support these lessons including creating their own healthy plate.

The 3-6 students have been learning about what a healthy, safe and active classroom looks like. They have been working together to discuss and identify rules and expectations in their classroom. The students have also discussed and identified ways to help make everyone feel safe and happy in the classroom, while also recognising how they show kindness, respect and how they can be fair.
