Barmedman History Excursion Recount



At Barmedman Public School we are learning about Remembrance Day and we made poppies to wear for our Excursion. We also made poppies to hang on our school walls. We discovered that Barmedman was originally named Barmedman Reefs. We went on our excursion with a map of Barmedman Reefs, to locate historical buildings, built and natural features and to lay a reef for

First, we walked down Robertson St. On the right side of the road, we found the Beiser's nan's house. We took a picture of the old blue house with a tin Dutch Hat roof. The Beiser's Nan's house also had an old-time outhouse because in the olden times there was no septic system. Jaydan



Next, we walked past the Police Station and saw the goal. It was on the corner of Star and Roberston Street. My uncle Greg and cousin Sam and Riley live there. We said hi to them and took a photo. 




After we saw the original Police Station and Goal, we walked further along Robinson Street and came to St. Johns Anglican church and outhouse. The current building was opened in 1938, replacing two earlier buildings, both were made of timber. The first wooden structure was opened in 1889 and the second, but larger building, opened around 1906. Khloe



After that, we walked past Ivy's house and then we came to St. John's Memorial Hall on the corner of Roberston St and Star St. It's a huge blue and cream building, made from double brick and iron construction. In the olden days, it was used as a meeting place for dancing and parties. We added this to our map. Tanay





We walked until we got to Queen St and saw the Barmedman Pub, which is old and beautiful but sadly deserted. On the other corner was the Beiser's house also

known as the Queensland Hotel which is no longer operating as a Pub. It is a two story brick hotel with 14 rooms and an upstairs verandah surrounding it. Jaydan



After the pubs we looked at the vintage hospital, that's what the cafe thought it was at the corner of Queen Street and Star Street. It's no longer running, and someone has purchased it. Next to it is the original Commonwealth Bank. It, too, is not up and running. Someone has brought it and is having a ball. Lachlan





Then we walked along Queen St, past the local café, and we saw a few vintage cool cars. Next, we walked past my home. It was nice to show my friends and teachers where I live. My home is in the main Street of Barmedman. It used to be a busy Pool Shop. Clayton





Right next to Khloe's house is the Post Office and General Store but it is not any of them now. It is a house now and the Post Office is at the truck stop. There was a well at the post office and a child fell in and the mother put her baby down and jumped in to save the child. Then the baby fell in too.
